- National police check
- Working with children check (WWCC)
- NDIS worker screening check
- Covid vaccination
- First aid certificate
- CPR certificate
- Manual handling certificate

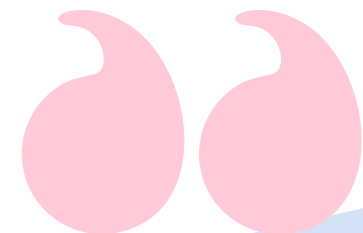
